

John W. Jolly Going Back To School Again

CHICAGO. — Thirty-eight top business executives from 14 states and one from Canada will attend Northwestern University's Institute for Management here in July. The Canadian "student" will be John W. Jolly, general manager of the Timken Roller Bearing Company's Canadian plant at St. Thomas, Ont.

The four-week accelerated study program in high level management, which opens Monday, July 5, is sponsored by Northwestern's graduate commerce division on the Chicago campus.

For four weeks the executives will live in Abbott hall, student dormitory, attending classes four hours daily. Preparation for each day's work will require a minimum of eight hours' work. In addition to regular classes and seminar discussions, the businessmen will hear talks by prominent spokesmen of industry, labor, government, and education. Special Saturday meetings will be devoted to problems of labor and communications.

Since 1951, some 176 executives from 82 companies, foreign and domestic, have completed the course. Applicants are nominated by their companies and final selection is made by an Institute committee. Due to the large number of applicants, another session of the 1954 Institute will be held Aug. 8 to Sept. 3.
